The Board of Directors of Cameron County Irrigation District #2 met in regular session in the office of the District upon the above date at 9:00 a.m.

The following Directors were present: Sam Simmons, Brady Taubert, Buck Rhyner, and Lupe Argullin. Also present were Craig Harmon, General Manager, and Buddy Dossett, Attorney.

Mr. Luis A. Arevalo was present to discuss Raymond Estates Subdivision. No action was taken at this time. This subdivision will be placed on the agenda for the June Board Meeting.

A motion was made by Brady Taubert, seconded by Buck Rhyner, and upon unanimous vote, passed to approve the minutes of the special and regular meetings of April 11, 2024.

The water report was made by Buck Rhyner, who reported that Falcon Reservoir contains 213,291 acre-feet of water of the normal conservation 2,666,203 acre-feet. The Amistad Reservoir contains 508,736 acre-feet of water of the normal conservation 3,226,704 acre-feet which 28.03% is U.S. total conservation capacity compared to 28.74% this time last year. As of May 4, 2024, the District's usable and storage water balances are 24,284.2273 acre-feet. This time last year, usable and storage water balances were 43,267.56473.

The Board reviewed the following subdivision plat and took the following action:

5.1) <u>The Cross Subdivision</u> – Being 2.62 acre tract of land out of 10 acres out of Block 130, Instrument Number 2011-0023009, and out of 65.37 acres of land consisting of that portion of Lot 12 lying north of the North Right-of-Way line of U.S. Highway 77, and all of Lot 13 lying north of U.S. Highway 77, out of Block 130, of the San Benito Land and Water Company Subdivision, as recorded in Volume 1, Page 6, of the Map Records of Cameron County, Texas. – AGH Engineering & Surveying. This subdivision is located on the corner of Williams Rd and Business 77. Since there is a pipeline that runs parallel to Business 77, the Board requested the developer to realign the easement to cover the existing pipeline. A motion was made by Buck Rhyner, seconded by Brady Taubert, and upon unanimous vote, passed to approve the plat pending a license agreement for a crossing. Motion carried.

5.2) <u>Del Rio Phase 9 Subdivision</u> – 10.34 acres out of Block E, James Dickinson Subdivision No. 1, Cameron County, Texas, recorded in Volume 4, Page 32, Map Records of Cameron County, Texas. – Moore Land and Surveying LLC. This subdivision is located on FM 281, west of Sam Houston, and south of Reservoir #1. This subdivision was previously approved on April 13, 2023 but was omitted from the minutes. No action was taken

5.1) <u>Camperos No. 1 Subdivision</u> – 10.00 acres of land out of Block 123, San Benito Land and Water Company Subdivision, recorded in Volume 1, Page 6, Map Records of Cameron County, Texas, being of the tract of land described in Document No. 2021-42894, Official Records of Cameron County, Texas. – Moore Land Surveying LLC. This subdivision is located off Mayfield Rd. and Shafer Rd. A motion was made by Buck Rhyner, seconded by Brady Taubert,

and upon unanimous vote, passed to approve the plat pending a license agreement for a crossing. Motion carried.

5.4) <u>San Sebastian Subdivision</u> – Being a south 5.0 acres of the north 15.0 acre tract of land, out of Block 253 San Benito Irrigation Land Company Subdivision in Volume 3, Pages 16-18, Map Records of Cameron County, Texas. – Altex Engineering. This subdivision is located off E. Brown Tract Rd. and North of Villafranco Rd. No easements were dedicated, and none needed. A motion was made by Buck Rhyner, seconded by Brady Taubert, and upon unanimous vote, passed to approve the plat as presented. Motion carried.

5.5) <u>Los Reyes Subdivision</u> – Being a 22.55 acre tract out of a 63.56 acre tract and a 10.68 acre tract out of Block 33, San Benito Land and Water Company Subdivision in Cameron County, Texas, according to map or plat thereof recorded in Volume 1, Page 6, of the Map Records of Cameron County, Texas and being the same tracts of land described in deed recorded in Document Number 26240, Official Records Cameron County, Texas. – Ferris, Flinn, & Medina LLC. This subdivision is located east of Gamble Rd. and north of Pennsylvania Rd. No easements were dedicated, and none needed. A motion was made by Buck Rhyner, seconded by Brady Taubert, and upon unanimous vote, passed to approve the plat as presented. Motion carried.

The Manager informed the Board that Chapter 11 of the Texas Water Code and Title 30 of the Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 288 requires Irrigation Districts to submit a Water Conservation Plan and a Drought Contingency Plan every five years. After discussion, a motion was made by Buck Rhyner, seconded by Brady Taubert, and upon unanimous vote, passed to adopt the following resolution adopting the Water Conservation Plan and Drought Contingency Plan as follows:

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS ADOPTNG A WATER CONSERVATION PLAN AND A DROUGHT CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR THE CAMERON COUNTY IRRIGATION DISTRICT #2 May 1, 2024 2024-002

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that the amount of water available to the Cameron County Irrigation District #2 and to its irrigation water customers is limited and subject to depletion during periods of extended drought;

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that natural limitations due to drought conditions and other acts of God cannot guarantee an uninterrupted water supply for all purposes;

WHEREAS, Applicable rules of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality require all public water supply systems in Texas to prepare a water conservation plan;

WHEREAS, Section 11.039 of the Texas Water Code authorizes water suppliers to distribute available water supplies on a pro rata basis during times of water supply shortage; and

WHEREAS, as authorized under law, and in the best interests of the customers of the Cameron County Irrigation District #2, the Board deems it expedient and necessary to establish certain rules and policies for the orderly and efficient management of limited water supplies during drought and other water supply emergencies;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CAMERON COUNTY IRRIGATION DISTRICT #2:

SECTION 1. That the Water Conservation Plan and the Drought Contingency Plan attached hereto and are hereby adopted as the official policy of the Cameron County Irrigation District #2.

SECTION 2. That the General Manager is hereby directed to implement, administer, and enforce the Water Conservation Plan and the Drought Contingency Plan.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
